## The Trinity Dome at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception

The completion of the Trinity Dome, in preparation  
for the 100th Anniversary,  
is a monumental undertaking for which the  
Bishops of the United States have approved a special  
one-time collection to take place on Mother's Day.  
Thank you in advance for your support of this collection.

In January 2017, artisans began applying the mosaic to the basilica's major interior dome, with the goal of completing the project before Christmas. Composed of more than 14 million pieces of colorful Venetian glass, it depicts the rich diversity of the Church in the United States.

Opposite the Trinity will be the Blessed Mother and in between will be 22 saints that have an association with the United States and the Basilica.

This mosaic will be the crowning jewel of American's National Shrine.

Does not believe in the resurrection.

**Gnosticism** - Belief that the human body is evil. Jesus was not incarnate, does not believe in the Trinity.


**Patty Holm**
