He was elevated to Bishop of Constantinople in 398 and was a famous and admired preacher. The content of his sermons and his exegesis of Scripture were never without a point. Sometimes the point stung the high and mighty. Some sermons lasted up to two hours. He called the Byzantine court and the powerful on their arrogance and behavior and because of this was forced into exile several times. He died en route at the little town of Comana, saying ”Glory be to God for everything. Amen.” His feast day is September 13. Who is he?
